Welcome to Future Pillars' second newsletter. This comes with huge thanks from the Trustees for the generosity of so many people which has enabled the children at Kabwe to continue to be supported throughout the changeover and with good prospects for the future. In order to do this we had to reduce the feeding programme to 3 days a week but hope to resume 5 days as soon as possible. We have also had to defer an intake of sponsored students for Skills Training, but the centre has continued to operate with courses for a smaller number of fee-paying students, whose fees will help to support the cost of free students. We hope to re-start this programme after several of the trustees visit Kabwe (at their own expense) in May. Our local partners have economised as far as possible, raised some funds locally and planted a large garden to help with the feeding programme. The challenge is ongoing but, working together, we can achieve great things to give a future to children and young people who otherwise would have little to look forward to in 2018 and beyond.

News from Kabwe

General News

Thanks to your generosity the Kabwe programmes have continued much as before. The cabbages in the newly planted garden are growing well and will help restore feeding 5 days a week – while the sale of some of the surplus will fund the purchase of more seed.

Text books have been supplied by Department of Education recently and several hundred pairs of plastic shoes have been donated by ZOCS, Zambia Open Community Schools ,an organisation which supports Community Schools offering education to Orphans and Vulnerable children.

An eerie hush descended on the site for exam weeks at the end of November and beginning of December, and the school and skills block are now on holiday until the start of the new school year in January.... though the sponsored students have been coming on site to use the library and receive extra tuitions.

Sponsorship



In this edition, at the start of the Zambian school year, we focus on our sponsorship programme.

In December pupils in grade 9 sat the national exams, with results due in January. Family Futures Community School only goes up to grade 9, so any student wishing to complete secondary education to grade 12 needs to transfer to a government school, where fees have to be paid. Fees and uniform costs amount to about £150 a year per pupil for the 3 years of schooling- and have to be paid up front each year in January. For many students these costs are

prohibitive, and their schooling ceases at this point.





We have a number of loyal sponsors who have provided funding for one or more students to complete grades 10 – 12 each year. It is tough for the students to move to new schools, but with hard work they can succeed, and we now have several who have progressed to tertiary education – and two who have qualified as teachers. We wanted to be able to take on another cohort in January 2018 and are grateful to the Drive Methodist Church in Sevenoaks who launched an appeal to raise £5000 to see a group of 10 students through their three years of schooling.... and have raised £5730!

We look forward to selecting the lucky 10 students, and to placing them at local government schools. During the May visit Rosemary will meet these new students, together with those already in the programme. Once again she will visit the schools and discuss the students' progress with them, bringing back pictures and letters to share with us all.
